## DEFINITIONS:

# - Classes may be split in the following divisions depending upon the individual class entries:

OPEN, AA, JR/YR. Note: Divisions AA & JR/YR may be combined.

\* - Please state test or level on entry.

**JR/YR** – Open to Juniors & Young riders only; any rider eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

**YR** – Open to Young riders only, ages 16 through 21 in the current year.

**JR** – Open to Junior riders only, ages 18 and under in the current year.

**AA or Adult Am.** – Open to Adult Amateurs only; competitors must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 & they must hold a current USEF Amateur card

**BLM** – Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championships qualifying class for 2011

**GAIG** – Qualifying class for the 2011 Great American/USDF Regional Dressage Championships – Riders are allowed to declare only ONE test per level per day as a GAIG qualifier

**TOC** – Test of Choice, please denote which test on entry

**MFS** – Musical Freestyle

**NAJRYC** - Qualifying class for the 2011 North American Junior Young Riders' Championships

This schedule is tentative. If the number of entries causes the judge's working time to exceed USEF allowable limits, the BLM Finals classes may be scheduled on different days than indicated above; this includes the possibility of Thursday Finals classes. No Times will be mailed, they will be on the show website. Competitors are responsible to confirm their own times upon arrival at the show -> they MUST check their times IN their show packet upon arrival at the show. Finals classes may be held at night under lights.

## 2010 CBLM Championship Finals Rules

### Rules Governing the Finals

1. The same tests used to qualify will be used in the Finals, except the FEI Pony, Junior & Young Rider tests listed above.
2. The tests must be ridden from memory and without whips.
3. Entries for the Finals classes should be sent to the current year's Finals Entry Secretary.
4. A horse/rider team may qualify at more than one level and all qualified horse/rider teams are permitted to compete in the Finals in consecutive qualified levels; this includes the corresponding Musical Freestyle finals.
5. Only ONE horse/rider combination may show in the Finals. If two riders qualify the same horse at different levels, the choice must be made and only one Finals horse/rider combination will be accepted by the Finals Show Secretary.
6. During the Finals competition, no horse entered in a Ljungquist Final may be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Final on that horse until that combination has finished their Finals class(es); this includes the awards ceremony.
7. Both the Training Level Final and the First Level Final for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at Third Level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**, and b) riders who **have** competed at Third Level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**.
8. Second through Third levels for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**, and b) riders who **have** competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**.
9. Fourth level for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at or above the FEI Intermediaire I level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**, and b) riders who **have** competed at or above the FEI Intermediaire I level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**.
10. Prix St Georges level for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at or above the FEI Intermediaire II level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**, and b) riders who **have** competed at or above the FEI Intermediaire II level at an USEF licensed show before **Oct. 21, 2005**.

**The closing date for this show is September 25, 2010.** The last weekend to qualify is **September 25-26, 2010.**

The results of BLM Qualifying classes will be used to qualify horse/rider combinations for the Finals of the 2010 Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship Finals. For riders who are members at the time of this show of either CAMDA, CDA, CDCTA, DVCTA, ECRDA, ESDCTA, FCDA, GSDA, IEO, LVDA, MDA, NCDCTA, OCDA, OVCTA, PVDA, SCDCTA, VADA, OR WPDA.

**EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.**

**Management reserves the right to add or divide classes, add or substitute judges, or make any changes required by circumstances.**

**LEVELS:** USEF Training Level Test 2 through FEI Grand Prix Special; USDF & FEI Musical Freestyle; including 2010 CBLM Finals classes; 2011 NAJRYC Qualifying, BLM Qualifying, & GAIG Qualifying classes; USDF Pas de Deux.

**AWARDS:** Trophy & six ribbons in each class. High percentage awards (Finals scores will be excluded): Overall, SR Overall, JR Overall, YR Overall, AA Overall, Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth Levels & FEI Levels combined, Freestyle combined (Freestyle scores are excluded in other high percentage awards). Other HS awards may be offered.

**BLM Championship Finals:** Ribbons awarded to eighth place; Training and First level will be pinned through 10<sup>th</sup> place. Formal award presentations to be scheduled at lunch break, dinner break and after evening classes and riders are required to attend the ceremony properly attired and mounted to receive their awards in the Coliseum. **Riders placing in 2010 BLM Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies. Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, to be present and properly attired, will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. Competitors may decline to participate in the victory round for safety reasons. Unmounted awards ceremonies can be held if weather or other calamity prevents mounted awards ceremonies. Riders must be in full riding attire. Requests to be excused from the awards ceremony must occur *one hour* before the scheduled ceremony, except in the case of an emergency. The requests must be made to the Awards Coordinator who must confer with BLM Coordinator, the Competition Manager, and the Technical Delegate in the decision-making process.** In each of the BLM FINALS CLASSES, a separate trophy and eight ribbons will be awarded for SENIOR RIDERS and JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDERS for each class in which at least four Junior/Young Riders compete. At least \$5,000 in prize money will be awarded in the BLM Open Finals classes. USEF rules pertaining to ties will be followed, Prize Money will be split. Thank you to the sponsoring GMOs: **CAMDA, CDA, CDCTA, DVCTA, ECRDA, ESDCTA, FCDA, GSDA, IEO, LVDA, MDA, NCDCTA, OCDA, OVCTA, PVDA, SCDCTA, VADA, OR WPDA.**

**Barbara Silverman Memorial Freestyle Award:** This award honors former VADA member Barbara Silverman, by promoting Musical Freestyles and the Women's Ovarian Cancer Foundation, two things that were very dear to Barbara. This memorial circuit awards requires the following freestyle scores: 2 scores from any USEF recognized shows & 1 score from the freestyle finals at the 2010 BLM Finals Competition. Three scores will be used to determine the MEAN score and placings 1 – 6 will be presented on Sunday, 10/24 (no ceremony), otherwise, they will be sent to the riders & posted on the website. Divisions: USDF Musical Freestyle (1<sup>st</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup>) and FEI Musical Freestyle (YR, Int. I & GP). Nomination Fee: \$40.00.

**Mary Beth McLean Memorial Perpetual Trophy:** This award remembers FEI rider Mary Beth McLean. The winner is determined by totaling the PSG & Int. 1 BLM finals scores, and they will receive a small trophy and their name will be engraved on the large trophy. Past recipients: 2005 - *Mary Alice Malone & Kashmir*; 2006 - *Heidi Storm Graham & Olympus*; 2007 - *James Koford & Don Principe*; 2008 - *Rebecca Nelles & Rymtik*; 2009 - *George Williams & Don Bailey*.

**USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Award** awarded from class 323, Second Level Test 3.

**ENTRIES:** Entries accepted by the **date received by the secretary.**

Telephone entries will not be accepted. All entries (competing & non-competing) **MUST** include a valid Coggins test (though 10/24/10) or the **entry WILL BE RETURNED**. Entries in Musical Freestyle classes (except JR/YR Freestyle) **MUST** be accompanied by a photocopy of a test verifying eligibility to enter the class (i.e. 60% at the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level from an USEF recognized show.

**NOTE:** Riders wishing to compete in the GAIG Qualifier must pay the \$10.00 fee. Classes may be split in the following divisions depending upon the individual class entries: OPEN, AA, Jr/Yr – the AA & Jr/Yr division may be combined. All divisions are pinned separately; exception: GAIG & BLM qualifying will be scored and pinned together, not as a separate class or divisions.

Be sure to include with your entry: Current (**valid**) **Negative Coggins test (1 year)**; USEF & USDF numbers & copies of all the cards (master verification sheet is preferred); and **ALL** required signatures in accordance with the USEF rules.
- \* Full refund minus **\$30 handling charge**, if the Entry Secretary is notified on or before 9/25/10. **NO REFUNDS AFTER THE CLOSING DATE, including the cancellation of classes due to Acts of God, Acts of terrorism, inclement weather and/or other circumstances!**
- \* An acknowledgement of entry **SHOWING STATUS** will be emailed to each competitor upon entry receipt. Please check this for any errors. If you have any problems or do not receive this confirmation, please contact the Secretary immediately. **Be sure your email address is LEGIBLE!**
- \* Competitors are reminded that the USEF rules require entry forms to be signed completely in all 3 signatures blocks and the coach where applicable (no photocopies!) JR/YR riders are reminded to include their birth date or their entries will be returned; **Junior riders CAN NOT sign as Rider or Trainer, please have your parent or guardian sign.**
- \*Freestyles: Rider must present a good quality CD and/or tape to the Secretary by **8 AM the day of the class**. There will be a sound check on Thursday, 10/20, from 5 – 7 PM and at other TBD times during the competition, near the lunch breaks in Ring 1.

**TIMES:** Please **DO NOT** include post card or envelope; times will be **ONLY** posted on the Competition website. Remember to check IN your packet when your check in for any changes.

**STABLING: \$160.00 Wednesday night through Saturday night** and any portion thereof; **\$60.00** for any consecutive 24 hr period & you are **LIMITED** to two (2) 24 hr periods and stable with requests **WILL** not be considered. Permanent stabling (10' x 10') on grounds (concrete walls, sliding doors, under roof). **NO Initial bedding.** Bedding & hay are available for purchase from the Horse Center Stable Office. Stabling will **NOT** be posted! Please check in at the Stabling Office upon arrival to receive your stable assignments and order any bedding, etc. **You MUST include an emergency contact (for the rider) and phone # on your entry blank.**

Normal arrival time is 12 noon the day preceding the horse show (10/20). Earlier arrivals must be coordinated with stable manager at least two weeks in advance. Early arrival fee: \$60.00 per night. Stabling assignments **CAN NOT** be changed without permission of the **Stable Manager**. Stabling request changes will be honored until 10/3/10, please make your stabling arrangements early! After this date, there is **NO** guarantee that you will be stabled with a certain group. **Layover Policy** -- Sunday night must coordinate through with the VHC Stable office and pay \$30 to the VHC.

**NON COMPETING HORSES:** Any horse not competing must fill out an Entry Form (all 3 signatures), including a current Coggins test, the \$35 non competing fee, \$30 Office fee and the applicable stable fees. Due to the large number of competing horses, these horses may be restricted in their ring time.

**DOGS:** No loose dogs are allowed anywhere on the premises. Loose dogs will incur a \$100 fine. No dogs permitted on the Coliseum concourse or at any ring entry points unless in a crated enclosure.

**SHOW OFFICE:** Hours: 7 AM – 7 PM. Phone #: 540-464-2962 (starting Wed at noon).

**ARENAS:** Competition: 2 Indoor coliseums; outdoor Grand Stand with lights; 3 or 4 all weather surface footing. All are 20m X 60m. Warm-up: 1 large covered; 2 or 3 outdoors, 1 small indoor – all with all weather surface footing. Lunging: Only allowed where posted.

**FOOD:** Available on grounds. Many eclectic restaurants are in Lexington, VA.

**MEDICAL WASTE:** All medical waste (needles, syringes, etc.) must **NOT** be discarded in stalls, manure pits, garbage cans or on grounds. All medical supplies must be place in appropriate Sharps containers located in each barn.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:**

**DIRECTIONS:** Exit I-81 onto I-64 West at Lexington, VA. Exit I-62 West at 1<sup>st</sup> exit (Lexington) and follow signs to the Virginia Horse Center.

**RECOGNITION:** USEF, USDF, VADA.

## **OTHER:**

Riders may substitute horses once they have entered only in the classes they were entered and a new entry form will be required. Farrier, Veterinarian, and Paramedic will be on grounds. All emergency numbers will be posted in the Show Office and near the pay phones.

## **Hold Harmless Clause**

- The Equine Activity Liability laws of the State of Virginia, VA Code Ann. Sec 3.2-6200-6203 state among its statutory provisions that , “NOTICE: Intrinsic dangers in equine activity, include (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant’s ability.” No Participant nor any participant’s parent, guardian, or representative shall have or make any claim against or recover from any equine activity sponsor, equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. It is further understood that each owner, rider, spectator, and other participants assume any and all risks of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions VADA Inc, The Virginia Horse Center, USDF, USEF, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, show management, show committee, and all other horse show personnel.

- Each barn has one sharps container per 50 horses available. Competition Management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- **USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT**  
**Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.**
- **ATTENTION COMPETITORS:** Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

**Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

#### **Memberships Defined**

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary on that same day.



## ***USDF Statement on Animal Welfare***

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

## Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating\* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

## Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.

A horse is not required to have registry papers.

## Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

\*Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly

## Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

## 2010 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

### Awards

#### 1. USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover Saddlery pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals they win during the competition season.

#### 2. USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award

A USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals in the same competition year.

#### 3. Year-End Awards

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and the reserve champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

### Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF participating or group member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.
